THE WILDERNESS ALLIANCE HAS IDENTIFIED APPROXIMATELY 272,440 ACRES of wildlands with wilderness characteristics recommended for additional protection. These roadless areas would link BLM, Forest Service and National Park wilderness quality lands in the Guadalupe Mountains and Carlsbad Caverns. The BLM lands include Pup Canyon, Long Canyon, Crooked Canyon, Rawhide Canyon, Dunnaway Canyon, Last Chance Canyon, Huapache Canyon, and other roadless lands with wilderness characteristics. The BLM wilderness study areas within the Guadalupe Mountains, or contiguous to them, include Devil's Den, McKittrick Canyon, Lonesome Ridge, and Mudgetts WSAs. Roadless lands in the Lincoln National Forest include Little Dog and Pup Canyon (adjacent to the BLM Pup Canyon), North Rocky Canyon, and Last Chance Canyon Inventoried Roadless Areas, as well as the Guadalupe Escarpment WSA.
